The Pension Benefit Guaranty Corporation (PBGC) is paying the pension benefits under the terminated pension plan named above. We used the pension plan's records, and the information provided by the participant to determine the amount of the PBGC benefit. We have completed our review and determined that you are entitled to receive a surviving spouse benefit because preretirement survivor annuity (PSA) coverage was in effect on the date of your spouse's death. You are entitled to receive monthly pension payments of \$140.31, Beginning on October 1, 2007.

The monthly payment listed above is in the form of a Straight Life Annuity that provides a benefit for the rest of your life. There is no survivor benefit.



Attached: relevant documents, including a copy of a letter, that PBGC just sent to me upon my request after just learning about the notification. Dated July 31, 1998, which I either never received or thought it was junk mail. In any event, apparently there was no follow up from PBGC, not only prior to or around the October 2007 commencement date for pension funds or any time after to November 2016 when I called them. I also maintain that I was not properly notified with something of that importance buy either certified mail or follow up correspondence.

Following there letter with info options and application form; I subsequently made inquiries via telephone to PBGC which I was able to turn up the information that I was eligible to start receiving monthly pension checks of \$ 140 per month, starting back on October 1, 2007.

I then started to ask the question, as I never knew of this pension entitlement, until now!

"CAN THE PENSION BENEFIT BE RETRO ACTIVE FROM THE ENTITLEMENT DATE

OF

OGFOBER 1, 2007 ???!"

Well, now it gets interesting. I then got a variety of different answers from different representatives in different departments (customer assistance, appeals department, legal dept., etc.) at least 5 or more inquiries with PBGC. The replies went something like this:

- 1.) " we don't start the pension payments until we receive the application "
- 2.) " we don't go back "
- 3.) " it is not our POLICY to go back "
- 4.) " I will have to call my boss and have him call you back "
- 5.) " I really don't know the answer to that question "
- 6.) " we don't have an obligation to go back ". (this was the strongest language of all that I talked with even though I never got an answer if they had a legal right not to go back retro active for a ("missing beneficiary" as PBGC defines me).



One of the PBGC representatives (the attorney, disclosed to me that they are aware that there are missing beneficiaries) said "we are glad we found you." I replied "well, actually I found you thanks to my neighbor that made me aware of PBGC"

Recently over the holidays, I spoke with my son in law's brother who works in pension funds in Madison, Wisconsin. He told me that " you don't want your pension to end up at PBGC. They press pensions " (meaning they squeeze pensions down monetarily when they can)


At this point I don't trust PBGC. They are a government "agency " but at the same time - a corporation ???? Are they a non-profit or a company buying up pension funds from bankrupted companies and then making it to a money game? That would explain the little effort to find beneficiaries, taping all phone calls, having an appeals division and a legal department. I couldn't find out my legal rights from PBGC and still do not know my legal rights regarding the pension as far as receiving the eligible intended amount from when it was effective starting October 1, 2007. Also I am 73 years old and I believe that by law you have to do something with a pension as far as the IRS is concerned which possibly implicates PBGC as well ??? I do know one thing- I do think something is very wrong here at least it feels that way to me. Am I being penalized for simply not knowing? Did in fact, PBGC not properly notify me. We know that PBGC never followed up and I have lived at the same addresses at for exactly 50 years and still reside there. (The address I am at now is temporary as I am here for extended stay over the holidays with family) As I have said, this is not about being ungrateful or trying to get more money for myself. It is about honoring my late wife's memory as she worked hard for Eastern airlines and would be disappointed to see a big part of her pension benefit thrown in the trash. I just want PBGC to do the right thing and I am not afraid to take them to court if my legal rights are not honored.

I am a retired firefighter with many old injuries and health problems, some of which are serious. Including an aorta aneurism. I don't know how long I have, but want to help my grandson with the pension proceeds.

Although representatives are very polite at PBGC, I don't know if you can get a truthful straight answer from PBGC regarding " the retro active question " there has to be a better impartial legal source that would know the answer in my case. (one high up rep. did say my case was "unusual"

It will be very interesting to see what you find out. Hope you had a nice Christmas and hope you have a healthy and Happy New Year.

Please be advised that has requested the assistance of the New England pension Assistance Project with respect to the issue of his survivor benefit pursuant to the abovenamed trusteed plan. Enclosed is a signed and notarized Release from authorizing this office to communicate on his behalf in this matter.

We are writing to seek clarification of the amount of the benefit payable to Mr. as the surviving spouse of the su December 8, 2015, conflicts with information the PBGC had previously provided to him in 1998.

In 1998, the PBGC informed Mr. that a monthly survivor benefit of \$140.31, would be payable to him as of October 1, 2007. This start date appeared to be correct, as it would have been the first month after the late Mrs. 55th birthday. The amount also appeared to be correct, according to the benefit calculation which was included. See copies of July 31, 1998, letter and benefit calculation, enclosed.

Based upon these 1998 documents, then, it appears that Managers should now be entitled to receive a lump sum representing benefit payments retroactive to October 1, 2007, as well as an ongoing monthly survivor benefit of \$140.31. The retroactive payment would be over \$14,000. The figures stated in your letter of December 8, 2015, do not agree with the 1998 benefit determination and would appear to create a substantial benefit forfeiture.

Please review this matter immediately and provide us with corrected information s benefit entitlement and amount, or with an explanation of the large discrepancy between the 1998 benefit determination and your recent correspondence.



Thank you for your recent correspondence regarding benefits due Richard W Haley as the surviving spouse of Deborah W Haley from the above mentioned pension plan. We have reviewed this matter and have determined that Mr may elect a one-time lump sum payment of \$2,578.00 plus PBGC interest or a monthly annuity in the amount of \$140.31 retroactive to 10/1/2007. Please review these options with him (further described below) and complete the appropriate application or applications as required.

Option 1: if Mr elects the one-time lump sum, the total amount including PBGC interest as of 3/1/2016 would be approximately \$6,949.00. With this election, he would only need to complete the enclosed Application for Lump-Sum Payment and return it to us in the envelope provided. This payment may be rolled over to an eligible retirement plan (an individual retirement account (IRA), an individual annuity, or a qualified trust or annuity plan). The enclosed Special Tax Notice Regarding Non-Periodic PBGC Payments further explains the potential tax consequences.

Option 2: If Mr would prefer a monthly annuity in lieu of the one-time payment, he would be eligible for \$140.31 per month in the form of a Straight Life Annuity with no survivor benefits. This payment would be retroactive to 10/1/2007, which is the latter of Earliest Retirement Date or the month following handly's date of death. This option would include a large back payment of \$14,171.31 plus PBGC interest. If Mr would like to elect this option, he would need to complete the Beneficiary Application for Pension Benefits (PBGC form 705) and Application for Lump-Sum Payment (PBGC form 720).
